These scholarships will include the registration fee (which includes morning and afternoon teas and lunches during the conference) and accommodation which will be arranged by the organisers. Attendees will be responsible for their travel arrangements and any additional costs.

The scholarships are for individuals who would not be able to attend the 2010 International Gambling conference in Auckland without the benefit of this scholarship.

Criteria for Tindall Foundation Scholarships

Purpose of the Scholarships

The Tindall Foundation has generously contributed funding for scholarships for the 2010 International Conference hosted by The Problem Gambling Foundation of New Zealand, the Auckland University of Technology and Hapai Te Hauora Tapui.

These scholarships will enable problem gambling providers and other community groups to attend the conference who would otherwise not be able to attend.

NB: These scholarships are only available to New Zealand residents.

One of the objectives of the conference is to share knowledge, information and experience across countries to enable problem gambling providers, researchers and government to work more effectively in eliminating gambling-related harm.

In addition to conference registration fees, the scholarships will include accommodation as arranged by the conference hosts for the duration of the conference and meals offered as part of the conference package. The cost of transportation and preconference workshops and other personal expenses are not included in the scholarship.

Each recipient will be required to write a brief report on what they will take away from attending the conference, which will be forwarded to the Tindall Foundation. This report will need to be submitted within three weeks of attending the conference. Failure to submit a report will result in the attendee's organisation being invoiced for all conference related charges.

Criteria

- Would not be able to attend the international conference without a scholarship
- Member of a community group or problem gambling service provider
- New Zealand resident

Application Process

Applications should state how you and the organisation that you represent hope to benefit from attending the conference and why you would be unable to afford to do so without a scholarship.

Scholarship expressions of interest must be received no later than Wednesday, 10 February 2010.
